



Continuous Integration and Merge Requests

- The cornerstone of Quality Assurance with CI/CD in SKAO is the Merge Request (MR)
- MRs are associated with short-lived branches, which are associated with Jira tickets
- Typically one Jira ticket should have one MR
- Lots of repetitive QA checking and training needed
- Dodgy Artefacts are quarantined and requested to be fixed with automatically opened MRs

We needed help with Quality Checks

- Merge Request Settings
- Missing Traceability Links
- Documentation Changes and Integration
- Pipeline checks to ensure all stages of DevOps lifecycle is followed
- Code Reviewer settings

Merge Requests (MRs)


- MR Checks & feedback messages

- Failure (♥): Violates SKA guidelines
- Warning (1): Follows anti-patterns / non-advised guidelines
- Information (): Useful message take note







- And development improvements, including Marvin and better documentation


License

ska-ser-skallop has a LICENSE file and the license is BSD 3-clause, so there should be no issues here. However Marvin is complaining that the license information is non-compliant.




Results & Metrics

Results & Metrics

- The SKA Observatory is committed to being an open source project
- Is part of Gitlab's Open Source Program
- Required: every repo <u>must</u> have an Open Source License
- Over 300 Repositories
- Pre-estimated time to compliance: 3 months
- Achieved in 1 MONTH!
